8 DAY ITINERARY

*Photographer's Tour &
Wildlife in General*

"Kijani" is the Swahili word for green and between December and March the southern Serengeti literally springs to life with fresh grasses attracting the great migration of wildebeest, zebras and gazelles. This is the time to appreciate the verdant beauty of the savannah, plains with many offroad areas and less visitors generally, you will be spoiled with a high concentration of wildlife and at times feel completely

alone in the wilderness. In this photographer's tour, we have also combined areas and parks normally popular in the dry season with photo-tourists, this is because the resident game is more active and less vehicles generally lead to great photographic opportunities.



8 DAY ITINERARY

- DAY 1. Meet at JRO airport and drive to Lodge, Arusha
- DAY 2. Drive to Tarangire (2 hours), full day game drive, overnight at Lodge
- DAY 3. Morning game drive, transfer to Ndutu Camp – (approx 5 hours*)
- DAY 4. Full day game drive, return to Ndutu Camp
- DAY 5. Full day game drive, return to Ndutu Camp
- DAY 6. Game drive to Central Serengeti, transfer to Lodge
- DAY 7. Game drive to Central Serengeti, transfer to
- DAY 8. Fly from Seronera to JRO airport at to arrive, fly home**

*Transfer times are approximate but usually accurate to plus or minus 30 minutes.

**This is dependent on the time of the international onward flight. It may be necessary to overnight near JRO airport – While we partner with a very reliable airline for internal flights, Auric Air, Extreme Expedition Limited cannot guarantee making same day flight connections.



DAY 1

- VIP collection at JRO Airport
- Drive to overnight in Lodge, Arusha (2 hours*)
- Relax and enjoy a delicious a la carte dinner

DAY 2

- Breakfast

- Drive to Tarangire National Park
- Game drive in Tarangire
- Overnight at the western Sangaiwe gate.
- Dinner

Tarangire has the largest population of elephants with herds sometimes 200-strong. There are also over 700 lions that live permanently in the Tarangire.

The landscape is varied with grasslands and swamps and dotted with the majestic prehistoric Baobab trees and dissected by the Tarangire river.

For the bird-lovers, there are almost 600 species to track down.

The lodge is adjacent to Tarangire National Park and overlooks Lake Burungi. Frequently elephants and buffalo will visit the camp.



DAY 3,4,5

- Breakfast
- Ndutu plains game drive
- Morning game drive Tarangire
- Drive to Ndutu NCA (6 hours)
- Overnight Ndutu Camp
- Dinner

The Ndutu area is classic savannah, characterized by flat grassy plains and the place to be to see the migration between December and March,

The unique aspect of the Ndutu area in Tanzania, particularly during the wildebeest calving season, is its accessibility for off-road game viewing.

Unlike many other national parks and reserves where off-road driving is restricted, Ndutu allows safari vehicles to venture off-road to get closer to the wildlife and witness the calving action up close. Tens of thousands of wildebeest, zebra and gazelle usually arrive in December to graze on the newly-watered, highly nutritious short grass plains. The Ndutu region is particularly rich in nutrients and water sources during this period due to the short rains, making it an ideal place for wildebeests to calve. The abundance of food and water helps ensure the survival of the newborn calves in their critical first few weeks of life. Camp is

situated in Ndutu Big Marsh area, the southern part of the Serengeti ecosystem. The camp is surrounded by indigenous trees and shrubs which encourage a huge number different birds and mammals to live around the area. For three nights you will stay at the Ndutu camp that offers peace and tranquility far from the madding crowd. The camp is perfect to explore the Ndutu region and after each sunset, return to the excellent hospitality of Ndutu Camp

DAY 6,7

- Breakfast
- The guide will stow the luggage
- Game drive to Central Serengeti
- Overnight at Camps or Lodge
- Dinner

Meaning 'endless plains' in the Maasai language, the Serengeti is undoubtedly one of the world's most celebrated wilderness areas.

This area is crossed by the thrilling spectacle of the annual migration.

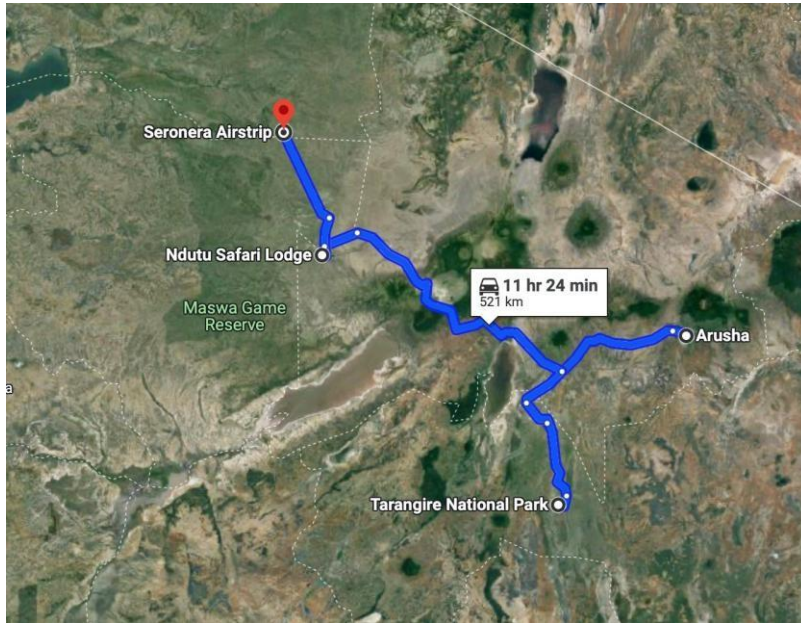


The Central Serengeti has high-density game-viewing at all times and is well-known for its large concentration of cats, so much so that until recently this area was set aside for scientific research into predators, especially cheetah.

This is a quality intimate bush camp, for an authentic bush experience, and is located in the centre of the Serengeti National Park. It lies 15 Km north of the wildlife area around Seronera, which has excellent permanent game. The furniture and accessories are carefully chosen for their luxurious feel and contemporary safari style.
